Starr Ranch is over 4,000 acres of pristine habitat located just east of Rancho Santa Margarita and Dove Canyon. The Ranch has a history of cattle ranching and most recently, hosting a myriad of research projects under the auspices of the Audubon Society.

We are delighted to again be able to partner with the Starr Ranch staff to bring this enjoyable afternoon.

Planned activities include several hikes of different levels of difficulty and length, from easy to moderate. A couple of Bird walks with an experienced birder will also be conducted.

As part of its research efforts, the Starr Ranch staff often have video monitors set up observing the nests and baby chick of various birds including hawks, owls, etc. Viewing these birds as the mother birds raise their young has always been a high point of the day.

The event is a planned fundraiser with the proceeds being shared with the Starr Ranch Conservancy as well as the Sierra Club to further our activities to "Explore, Enjoy, and to Protect the Wild Places of this Earth"



Food will be provided and will include various salads, fresh fruit, beans, salsa, chips, hamburgers and veggie burgers with all the accompanying items such as mustard, mayonnaise, pickles, onions, and lettuce.

TOLL ROAD STILL HAS ACTION BEING TAKEN.

There has been a lot of action by the Transportation Corridor Agency (TCA) over the last month in moving Tesoro extension of the Foothill South (241) Tollroad forward. The [TCA recently filed an environmental permit](#) with the San Diego Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) for the first section of the road (this is one of many permits they need to obtain). Their RWQCB application is grossly inadequate—TCA is overlooking impacts to important wetlands, the San Juan Creek, and the surrounding watershed (which could potentially affect the coastal zone). Learn more [here](#). More importantly the RWQCB will hold a public meeting on this permit on **Wednesday March 13th at 9am** at the Costa Mesa City Council Chambers at 77 Fair Drive, Costa Mesa. We need you at the meeting to stop this permit! Please put it on your calendar.

We also need you to send a message to the RWQCB asking them not to approve the permit so they will delay their decision and make the March 13th meeting a workshop rather than a decision point. At a recent meeting last week with RWQCB staff we were told that is possible, but only if the RWQCB get's enough messages from the public asking for the extension. An action alert and talking points for letters and public comment at the meeting are being developed, I will send them out for your use as soon as I get them. So keep any eye out for more information on this important item.

SAN ONOFRE NUCLEAR PLANT

"The degree of design changes and the level of risk posed by a restart now require a thorough and transparent hearing, such as that provided by the Adjudicated License Amendment (ALA) process. Anything less than this will have a devastating impact on the credibility of the NRC as a guardian of the public interest," says Glenn Pascall, Chair of the San Onofre Task Force of the Sierra Club.

"We take Chair Macfarlane at her word when she says it is her intention to assure the public that the NRC process is open, thorough and balanced. We do not believe this goal can be reached without a series of hearings on the level of an ALA."

Last week Senator Barbara Boxer (D-CA), Chair of the Senate Committee on Environment and Public Works, and Representative Ed Markey (D-MA), Ranking Member of the House Natural Resources Committee, sent a letter to Nuclear Regulatory Commission Chair Macfarlane in which they "urge the NRC to immediately conduct a thorough investigation into whether Southern California Edison (SCE) and Mitsubishi Heavy Industries (MHI) did in fact fail to make needed safety enhancements to avoid the license amendment process" for the San Onofre nuclear power plant's replacement steam generators
