TRAIL MAINTENANCE UPDATE

In the last issue, we profiled John Kaiser and his Trail Maintenance crew. Little did we know that our timing was right on!

On December 30th, one of the bigger storms of several years hit Orange County and the Santa Ana Mountains. The trees and chaparral were quite dry and stressed out due to the multi year drought. As a result, unusually cold weather, high winds, etc. hit the wilderness hard. 10 to 12 inches of snow fell on the trees and bushes resulting in many broken branches and entire chaparral bushes being uprooted.

John was notified right after the first of the year of the extensive damage and closure of many of the trails. He contacted his list of trail maintenance volunteers and instituted a plan to conduct emergency trail maintenance two days a week (on Saturdays and Wednesdays) through January and once a week in February.



Virtually all of the trails in the San Mateo Wilderness were all but impassable. The crews, ranging from 5 volunteers to 15 on a day, worked using long handled loppers and hand saws to open the trails. Many of the broken trees and branches were six to 12 inches in diameter. Where possible, the crews sawed the branches or trees into pieces and removed them from the trail. The chaparral were thinner so they were cleared by cutting the branches and dragging them out of the trail. Some of the trees



were too large for a hand saw to cut and chain saws are not allowed in the Wilderness so temporary trails were cut around them.

Some days, the crew cleared a couple of miles of trail, others only two tenth of a mile were cleared. Here are a couple of photos on the Bear Canyon Trails

Serrano Creek Trail**

4.7 mi one way, 590' gain. 0417-Sierra Sage of SOC Group Outing

O: Old Sugarloaf (3326'); Sierra Sage, Lower Peaks

Starting from Bluejay Campground, we will hike to the original and higher of the two peaks in the Santa Ana Mountains that have been designated as Sugarloaf at various times. The hike initially goes downhill to Chiquito Basin, climbs to a ridge, and then gradually descends to the base of Sugarloaf before the final climb to the peak on a steep and brushy use trail. Long sleeves and pants are recommended. The return hike backtracks the same route. The roundtrip distance is 9 miles with 2100' of cumulative gain. Rain or critical fire level will cancel. Bring lunch, plenty of water, good hiking boots. Meet at 8 am at the south OC ride share location or 8:50 at the trailhead (west end of Bluejay campground).
